Why do people migrate? There can be 'push' and 'pull' reasons A 'push' reason is one that makes people want to leave a place, it pushes them out A 'pull' reason is something that is attractive about the new place, that makes people want to go to it, it 'pulls' people towards it

Why do people create toy models? Explore Have pairs of students identify and list models they see in their classroom For each model, ask them to answer questions such as: In what ways does the model differ from the real thing? In what ways is the model similar to the real thing? Why do we use this model in the classroom? Explain Tell students that scientists use models to help explain ideas

Background knowledge Force can change the shape of an object as it pushes or pulls on it Some shapes can withstand greater forces than others For example, you can easily crush a styrofoam cup by squeezing its sides, but it is more difficult to crush the cup by squeezing it from top to bottom
